Enclosed with this letter you will find Complaint Forms against the five referenced veterinarians for malpractice resulting in the death of my beloved horse, Harvey. Litigation in Bastrop County District Court, 21st Judicial District, Cause No. 087-21, has recently settled.

Along with the complaint forms, you will find dated photographs, the clinic notes and receipts from Bastrop Veterinary Hospital, a video link dated December 1, 2013 showing how lame Harvey was before he was finally referred to A&M, and the summary of Harvey's December, 2013 stay at A&M's Large Animal Hospital by Dr. Ashlee Watts, more photographs, and the concluding summary as well as A&M's billings. Harvey was euthanized on April 24, 2014 at my home in Smithville, Texas, by veterinarians from Elgin Veterinary Hospital after a long and very painful fight for survival. Euthanasia was recommended by Dr. Robert Lewis of Elgin Veterinary Hospital and Dr. Ashlee Watts of A&M.

Also enclosed is the full February 29, 2016 Deposition with Exhibits of Dr. Lucy Pustejovksy where she admits knowing what should have been done for Harvey and admitting neither she nor any of the veterinarians at Bastrop Veterinary Hospital conducted any of standard protocols that were required under the circumstances to save Harvey. Every single warning sign of a joint infection was present at every stage of Harvey's treatment at Bastrop Veterinary Hospital. Every one of those warning signs was ignored, overlooked and/or misdiagnosed. Further, Dr. Pustejovsky as part of her treatment regimen advised walking an extremely lame horse to move him around. There is no excuse for the manner in which Harvey was treated at Bastrop Veterinary Hospital, and no excuse for their failure to refer Harvey to Elgin or A&M at a much earlier stage.

Harvey's senseless torture and death has been deeply traumatizing to me. Harvey should have been alive and well for another twenty years for me to enjoy. I have had to move from Bastrop County and at this date am still trying to find new retirement plans. I am available to meet with the Board or its investigators at their convenience to provide further information at the contacts below. PLAINTIFF'S FIRST AMENDED PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW PLAINTIFF JUDY SANTERRE complaining of DEFENDANTS BASTROP VETERINARY HOSPITAL LARGE ANIMAL SERVICES, P.C., DR. JEFFERY SCHROEDER, DVM, DR. DARREN WEISS, DVM, DR. STEFANIE MOSLEY, DVM, and DR. LUCY PUTESJOVSKY, DVM, and would show the Court as follows.

I. Discovery Control Plan

Discovery in this case is intended to be conducted under Level 2.

II. Parties

Plaintiff JUDY SANTERRE ("Ms. Santerre") is an individual who resides in Bastrop, Bastrop County, Texas.

Defendant Bastrop Veterinary Hospital Large Animal Services, P.C. ("BVH") is a Texas professional corporation having its principal place of business in Bastrop, Bastrop County, Texas. BVH previously appeared for all purposes in this matter.

Defendant Dr. Jeffery Schroeder, DVM ("Schroeder") is an individual who resides in Bastrop, Bastrop County, Texas. He has previously appeared for all purposes in this matter.

Defendant Dr. Darren Weiss, DVM ("Weiss") is an individual who resides in Austin, Travis County, Texas. He has previously appeared for all purposes in this matter.

Defendant Dr. Stefanie Mosley, DVM ("Mosley") is an individual who resides in Dallas, Dallas County, Texas. She has previously appeared for all purposes in this matter.

Defendant Dr. Lucy Putesjovsky, DVM ("Putesjovsky") is an individual who resides in Wharton, Wharton County, Texas. She has previously appeared for all purposes in this matter.

III. <u>Jurisdiction and Venue</u>

The Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to § 25.0003, TEX. Gov't Code. Venue is proper in Bastrop County, Texas because all or part of the events giving rise to this lawsuit occurred there. The amount in controversy exceeds the minimum jurisdictional amount for this Court and the monetary relief sought is over \$200,000 but less than \$1,000,000.

IV. Facts of the Case

This lawsuit arises from the tragic -- and needless -- death of Ms. Santerre's beloved horse, Harvey. In September 2013, Ms. Santerre brought Harvey - an otherwise healthy 10-year old palomino performance gelding - to the Bastrop Veterinary Hospital ("BVH") for diagnosis and treatment of a fresh cut on his right front ankle. When the Defendant vets, all employees of

BVH, accepted him for treatment on September 20, 2013, Harvey's prospects for a full and complete recovery were excellent. The Defendants portrayed themselves as possessing the clinical knowledge, experience and expertise to properly diagnose and to treat Harvey's injury, and to fully investigate and appropriately manage complications typically associated with such an injury. Their failure to do any of those things ultimately resulted in Harvey's death on April 24, 2014.

It is well-accepted that puncture wounds or lacerations of the limb over or near a joint or tendon sheath commonly result in joint infections in mature horses. It is likewise well-accepted that the most important part of treatment is early recognition of the condition and immediate (and appropriate) treatment. Well-documented clinical experience confirms that if a joint infection is not properly diagnosed and treated promptly and aggressively, then the chances of survival (let alone recovery) are significantly reduced. Accordingly, a wound over a joint is potentially life-threatening, and thus should be considered -- and must be treated as -- a medical emergency.

Defendants apparently took none of the recognized steps to prevent or detect a joint infection. Within days of initial treatment, Harvey's ankle swelled, the stitches broke, and a thick, yellowish fluid began draining from the wound. The lameness in his right leg intensified. These are well-known clinical signs of a joint infection, and clearly warranted immediate and aggressive treatment. Defendants, however, completely ignored these red flags.

Ms. Santerre kept Defendants fully informed of these developments as they occurred. She spoke to the Defendants on the phone and also sent them photos of Harvey's ankle. She asked repeatedly if she should bring Harvey to the clinic for an examination, diagnostic testing,

and an alternative treatment protocol. The Defendants consistently told her that no further examination or other treatment was warranted.

By way of illustration, on October 17, 2013, Ms. Santerre emailed a photo of Harvey's swollen ankle to Defendant Weiss. The photo clearly showed a thick yellowish discharge coming from the joint. Defendant Weiss confirmed receipt of both the photograph and Ms. Santerre's verbal description of Harvey's worsening condition. He did nothing more than to prescribe another round of the same medication (SMZ tablets) that clearly was having no effect. In the meantime, Harvey's condition was getting worse by the day.

On November 8, 2013, Ms. Santerre brought Harvey to the BVH and insisted that his deteriorating condition be re-evaluated. The top layer of the ankle wound had closed over, the joint was extremely swollen, and Harvey was profoundly lame. These are classic clinical indicators of a full-blown joint infection; indeed, there are few other explanations for profound lameness and effusion in a joint in an adult horse. Ms. Santerre specifically questioned Defendant Putesjovsky whether Harvey had a joint infection in his ankle. Defendant Putesjovsky assured Ms. Santerre that he did not. In connection with this "diagnosis," however, she did nothing more than to take two x-rays; neither was a view that would have shown changes in the bony structure of the joint associated with an infection. She prescribed "hand walking," and told Ms. Santerre that "Harvey would be fine."

In fact, however, under these circumstances a prudent vet would have immediately taken further diagnostic steps and would have implemented an aggressive treatment protocol. Such steps should have included, *inter alia*, taking a sample of the joint fluid for clinical analysis, blood work, and/or ultrasonography. Defendants took none of the appropriate diagnostic steps,

nor did they advise Ms. Santerre that such diagnostic procedures were warranted under the circumstances. As a result, Harvey's condition worsened.

Over the next 20 days, Ms. Santerre continued to apprise the Defendants of Harvey's deteriorating condition. They did nothing other than dispense bute and banamine, two anti-inflammatories that did nothing to address the massive infection in Harvey's ankle joint.

Ms. Santerre brought Harvey to the clinic again on November 29th. His ankle was even more swollen and he was "grade 4" lame. Defendant Putesjovsky performed no diagnostics at all; nevertheless, she again assured Ms. Santerre that Harvey did not have a joint infection. She put a sweat wrap on Harvey and sent him home. The proper treatment protocol at that point almost certainly would have involved some combination of joint lavage, intravenous and intramuscular antibiotics (or even local antibiotic administration), and arthroscopy. The warm, moist condition created by a sweat wrap Defendant Putesjovsky applied likely acted as a bacterial "super-charger" that kicked the ever-worsening infection into high gear.

Ms. Santerre called the clinic on December 2nd to report that Harvey's condition had not improved with the sweat wrap. The next day, the Defendants finally admitted for the first time that they had no idea what was wrong with Harvey or how to properly diagnose and treat his condition. They suggested that Ms. Santerre take Harvey to the veterinary teaching hospital at Texas A&M. Harvey was hospitalized at Texas A&M the next day. Proper diagnostic procedures revealed that under Defendants' "care" Harvey had developed a severe joint infection that, by the time the Defendants referred Harvey to Texas A&M, was extremely advanced. The veterinary professionals at Texas A&M implemented an aggressive treatment protocol, and even performed surgery on Harvey's ankle. But as a result of the Defendants' repeated failures to

follow accepted diagnostic protocol, resulting misdiagnoses and consistently improper treatments, Harvey's joint infection had become too advanced and severe, even before they even referred him for proper care. Due to the Defendants' misconduct, the measures taken by the vets at Texas A&M were not effective. Upon independent recommendations made by two highly-qualified veterinarians, Harvey was euthanized on April 24, 2014.

V. Causes of Action

Despite holding themselves out as experienced, competent practitioners of veterinary medicine, the Defendants failed to give any attention to the likelihood that Harvey would develop a joint infection as a result of his ankle laceration. They ignored the very clear and dramatic warning signs that were both readily-observable, well-known to competent veterinary medicine practitioners, and repeatedly called to their attention. They took none of the diagnostic steps that were warranted under the circumstances. They directed a treatment protocol that fell far short of (and, in the case of the sweat wrap, was completely the opposite of) the accepted protocol for treatment of a joint infection. When Ms. Santerre asked them directly whether Harvey might have a joint infection, they assured her he did not; yet they had taken not a single one of the generally-accepted diagnostic steps required to make that determination. By the time they finally referred Ms. Santerre and Harvey to a qualified veterinary professional, his condition had deteriorated to such an extent that he could not be saved.

At all times relevant to the events giving rise to this lawsuit, the individual Defendant veterinarians were acting within the course and scope of their employment with BVH. Their acts and omissions alleged herein were within the general authority given them, were in furtherance of the business of BVH, and were for the accomplishment of the object for which the Defendant

veterinarians were employed. Accordingly, BVH is vicariously liable in connection with the acts and omissions of the individual Defendant veterinarians.

A. <u>Veterinary Malpractice</u>.

Defendants had a duty to meet the applicable standard of care in this case. Through their acts and omissions, they fell short of that standard. Such acts and omissions include, without limitation:

- Misdiagnosis
- Incorrect treatment
- Failure of skill in nonsurgical treatment
- Incorrect kind or amount of medication
- Violation of commonly accepted protocols
- Inadequate supervision
- Failure to provide preventative care
- Failure to suggest a referral to a specialist, or otherwise more qualified veterinarian

Defendants' acts and omissions resulted in Harvey's prolonged and deteriorating medical condition, and ultimately his death. Such acts and omissions were the proximate cause of Harvey's death and Ms. Santerre's damages.

B. Ordinary Negligence.

In the alternative, the Defendants' acts and omissions described above constitute ordinary negligence. Defendants had a duty not to engage in conduct that resulted in injury to Harvey. By their acts and omissions described herein, Defendants breached their duty. Defendants' acts and omissions were the proximate cause of Harvey's prolonged and deteriorating medical condition, his death, and Ms. Santerre's damages.

C. Actual and Exemplary Damages.

Defendants' wrongful conduct was the proximate cause of Ms. Santerre's actual damages including, without limitation, charges for medical treatment for Harvey, transportation costs, expenses for medicine, bandages and other necessary supplies and equipment, loss of use, and finally the total loss of Harvey.

Defendants' conduct was the result of malice and/or gross negligence, for which Texas law authorizes an award of exemplary damages in an amount to be determined by the trier of fact under Chapter 41 of the Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code.

Ms. Santerre seeks to recover all such actual and exemplary damages herein.

VI. Conditions Precedent

All conditions precedent to Ms. Santerre's right to recover herein have occurred or have been fulfilled.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Plaintiff Judy Santerre requests that upon final trial hereof, she be awarded her actual and exemplary damages, equitable relief as requested herein, her recoverable attorneys' fees and costs, and such other and further relief, at law or in equity, to which she may show herself justly entitled.

ANSWER:

September 20, 2013:

I arrived home from work and found Harvey badly injured from an attack by an ugly neighbor that I had refused to go out with. I took Harvey to BVH, which had been my veterinarians for 14 years at that point. Stephanie Mosley and Heidi Moore were the veterinarians there that evening. Heidi Moore took photos of Harvey's injury. They knew Harvey's injury had occurred that morning and was approximately ten hours old. They knew it had rained five inches in Smithville that day and Harvey had stood in that rain with dirty rainwater washing over that gaping wound for hours. Stephanie Mosley unwrapped the wound, sedated Harvey, and cleaned the wound and stitched it up, sending us home with ten days supply of SMP tablets. Mosley said nothing about the seriousness of Harvey's wound. Heidi Moore made the statement, "We'll just have to watch that and see if it gets a joint infection in it." I did not know how wrong that statement was until much later. Mosley told me the stitches probably would not hold. Heidi Moore told me Harvey would be just fine.

Standard procedures would have been to immediately refer Harvey to a competent veterinarian capable of determining whether the joint was involved and upon determination that it was, begin appropriate treatment.

Mosley and Moore treated Harvey as if he had a minor flesh wound. He had a major wound over a joint which is a medical emergency.

Wrong diagnosis and wrong medication. None of the proper protocols were followed to determine joint involvement which would have saved Harvey.

Records should have noted the degree of seriousness of this wound. Records should have noted the age of the wound, the fact it was 8-10 hours old, that the horse had been standing in rain that day (five inches) and was dirty, and the likelihood of joint involvement. Records incorrectly state Harvey was not walking well when found wounded, but in fact he was not walking at all. I had phoned in order to get instructions how to get him moving so that I could load him and bring him in. I was told to inject 10cc banamine in a vein, which I did. Records should have included the photos taken by Heidi Moore. Records should have noted the presence of Heidi Moore.

I took Harvey back to BVH because the stitches had come out. Stephanie Mosley with Heidi Moore cut away tissue around the wound and wrapped it. It was very bloody and hard to watch. I was sent home with four more days of SMP. The wound was discharging, but neither veterinarian took a sample for testing. Again, Harvey was not referred to a veterinarian capable of saving him.

Attached is a photo of Harvey's injury. I don't know if this is where he is supposed to be or not. I've been lucky enough to never have to deal with an injury this severe. I am concerned that this wound is still so open. I gave him the last of his antibioltic this morning. Yesterday, he didn't eat with the usual vigor and I took his temperature but it was normal (just above 100). He ate better last night and this morning. He's pooping and drinking water normally. I am hydroing for 10 minutes every night and changing his bandage, using the Granulex. He doesn't limp or appear to be in pain, except at the wound site. It just looks awful. If you want to see him, I can bring him in tomorrow morning (or sooner if you think it's serious).







October 17, 2013

Harvey's leg was not improving. I took photos and emailed them to Dr. Weiss. I phoned him later in the day and asked if he had gotten my email and seen the photos. He said he had and would leave some antibiotics for me to pick up. I pick them up on the way home from work (more SMZ-TMP). I saw Schroeder's email later (told me to continue the antibiotics and bandaging). I had been using Bastrop Vet for fourteen (14) years at this point and it was not unusual for me to email them and phone later. I owned five dogs and two horses at this time and saw them often.

Comment:

The photos and email sent on October 17, 2013 show a swelling joint and the email reports increasing fluid draining from it. Harvey's injury at this point was four weeks old and clearly getting worse. The fluid draining from the wound was synovial fluid. Continuing SMP tablets beyond four weeks in the face of swelling and increasing discharge without asking a fourteen year client to bring Harvey in for examination and testing of that fluid was negligent or grossly negligent. There is no way these veterinarians could have known what was draining from the wound without testing it, which is standard procedure and one of the standard protocols.



At some point late in October, 2013 or early November, 2013:

At some point late in October or early November, 2013, I was at the clinic for one of my dogs and spoke to Weiss who was at the reception area while I was there. I told him I was nearly out of antibiotics for Harvey and wanted more. He told me, "No, it's not helping." I was surprised that he was taking Harvey off of antibiotics. I told him Harvey was getting worse, not better. Weiss told me that maybe Harvey reinjured himself. He did not ask me to bring Harvey in to see him, nor did he prescribe a different antibiotic. I was confused but Weiss clearly knew what was going on with Harvey and I trusted him.

Violation by Darren Weiss:

Patient record keeping, Rule 573.52, Rules Pertaining to the Practice of Veterinary Medicine, Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners, Texas Administrative Code, Title 22, Part 24, Chapter 573.

There was no record made of this contact at all but clearly there were internal discussions about Harvey's treatment since Darren Weiss appeared to be aware of what was going on.



November 8, 2013

Harvey had grown increasing lame and I was very concerned about his condition. On the one to five scale, Harvey was at a three, walking with big head bobbing. I phoned for an appointment with Darren Weiss and was told "if he's available." I wanted a more experienced veterinarian to see Harvey.

I was disappointed to see Lucy Pustejovsky come out to treat Harvey, but we discussed his lameness. She took x-rays of the front and side of Harvey's right foot. I asked Lucy Pustejovsky if Harvey had a joint infection because I had gone online to see what was wrong with him and everything pointed to a joint infection. Lucy Pustejovsky said no, he doesn't have joint infection. I said are you sure because my research was indicating this was a joint infection. She repeated it, no, absolutely not, he does not have a joint infection. She repeated it enough and was insistent enough that I believed her. Then I asked, then what is it? She said, I don't know but it's definitely not a joint infection. He should be fine, so let's give it more time. And then she said "You should hand walk him" I told her he was in too much pain to want to walk. As I was leading Harvey away, Lucy followed and stated "Boy, he sure is lame."

Violations by Lucy Pustejovsky (with comments):

Either Lucy Pustejovsky or Stephanie Mosley entered Stephanie Mosley as the attending veterinarian on November 8, 2013. That is false. It was Lucy Pustejovsky who took the appointment on November 8, 2013 and also on November 29, 2013. In the clinic notes, Lucy Pustejovsky stated Harvey was doing well and went downhill, and that is false. Harvey had not been doing well from the date of his injury. Lucy Pustejovsky stated Harvey did not have significant lameness. Harvey had lameness Grade 3 and with Harvey's history of a deep gash over a joint, that was extremely significant. Lameness is why I took Harvey in that day he was clearly getting worse. Lucy Pustejovsky told me to hand walk Harvey and this is not in the record either. I was following Lucy Pustejovsky's veterinary advice as I waited for another three weeks for Harvey to get well, phoning Bastrop Veterinary Hospital to keep them advised as he continued to deteriorate. In fact, Harvey did have a joint infection, which was foreseeable and preventable and survivable had these veterinarians followed standard procedures.
- (5) Principles of Veterinary Medical Ethics of the American Veterinary Medical Association: II. Professional Behavior, A. and B.

- (6) Unnecessary treatment advice (hand walking a Grade 3 lame horse while claiming not to know what was causing the lameness and while stating there was no joint infection when there was a joint infection), Section 801.402(12).
- (7) Gross malpractice, Section 801.402 (16). Lucy Pustejovsky is responsible for injuring Harvey so badly he could not be saved. In her Deposition, Lucy Pustejovsky states she knew what was supposed to be done for Harvey, but she did not do those standard protocols.





November 29, 2013

Increasingly frantic over Harvey's deteriorating condition, I took Harvey back to Bastrop Vet. I called first and made an appointment with Dr. Darren Weiss. They told me "if he's available" but when I got there, Lucy Pustejovsky again walked out. Harvey was grade 4 to 4.5 lame by this time. Lucy looked at him and again told me again that he did not have a joint infection. I asked for a referral to A&M. Lucy said no, I want to try a sweat wrap first. She told me to put him in a larger pen and move him around. She said call on Monday if he hasn't gotten any better. She put a sweat wrap on him and sent us home with some more Bute.

Contrary to Lucy Pustejovsky's statements in her Deposition, she did not mention a referral to me. I asked for one and she refused. She waited to refer him until his joint was completely destroyed. She also advised me to move an extremely lame horse around, which constitutes animal cruelty.

I refer you to the video of Harvey attempting to walk which I took on December 1, 2013 before I took Harvey to A&M. The video can be viewed online at https://vimeo.com/164328873.

Note that Lucy Pustejovsky's actions on November 29, 2013 were completely consistent with her actions on November 8, 2013.

Violations by Lucy Pustejovsky (with comments):

- (1) Professional Standard of Care, Rule 573.22
- (2) Responsibility of veterinarian to refer a case, Rule 573.24. Lucy Pustejovsky refused my request for a referral to A&M.
- (3) Honesty, Integrity and Fair Dealing, Rule 573.27
- (4) Patient record keeping, Rule 573.52, Rules Pertaining to the Practice of Veterinary Medicine, Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners, Texas Administrative Code, Title 22, Part 24, Chapter 573. Lucy Pustejovsky stated Harvey had Grade 3 lameness when in fact he had Grade 4 to 4.5 lameness. Lucy denied again that Harvey had a joint infection and that is not in her clinic notes. Pustejovksy's clinic notes state "possible joint and tendon sheath involvement" when in fact it was very obviously present. Lucy Pustejovsky refused my request for a referral and that is not in her clinic notes.

Lucy Pustejovsky wrote in the clinic notes for November 29, 2013 that Harvey's lameness was "worse when first starts moving." This was not true. Harvey was profoundly lame with a severely septic joint.

Lucy wrote in the notes for December 2, 2013 that Harvey's swelling was improved. She did not see Harvey on December 2, 2013, and I did not tell her his swelling had improved. In fact,

Harvey's swelling could not have improved because his joint was full of "thickened tissue" per Dr. Ashlee Watts at A&M. The joint wash taken by Dr. Watts on December 4, 2013, showed 98% neutrophils, confirming severe joint sepsis.

Lucy did not agree to the referral I asked for until December 2, 2013 when she returned my phone calls to her and told me that she "had consulted with her colleagues" and they did not know what was wrong with Harvey and I should take him to A&M. I asked Lucy to call my cell phone when she had scheduled the appointment for Harvey because I would not be in the office on December 3, 2013. Lucy phoned my office phone and left a message there. I called Bastrop Vet the afternoon of December 3, 2013 to find out when my appointment was. I took Harvey to A&M on the morning of December 4, 2013.

- (5) Principles of Veterinary Medical Ethics of the American Veterinary Medical Association: II. Professional Behavior, A. and B.
- (6) Unnecessary treatment advice (hand walking and moving around a Grade 4 4.5 lame horse while claiming not to know what was causing the lameness and stating there was no joint infection when there was in fact a severe joint infection), Section 801.402(12).
- (7) Gross malpractice, Section 801.402 (16). In Lucy Pustejovsky's clinic notes for November 29, 2013, she notes "possible joint and tendon sheath involvement" but sent Harvey home in a sweat wrap with bute as the only medication. A sweat wrap was contraindicated in the presence of a joint infection. Asking me to move Harvey around in that condition was animal cruelty.

These veterinarians and especially Lucy Pustejovsky injured Harvey so severely he did not survive, despite A&M's best efforts to save him.







December 4, 2013

I took Harvey to A&M and was horrified to hear what Dr. Watts told me. Dr. Watts screamed when she saw Harvey "Why am I getting him so late?!" Harvey had a severe joint infection. Dr. Watts asked me if I wanted to put him down. I did not believe what she was telling me. A&M treated the infection. On December 23, 2013, they stopped treatment, feeling they had gotten it all. I kept believing Harvey would be okay and that he would walk a lot better after the treatment. On Christmas day, I visited Harvey. It was two days after the last of the anesthetics had been given and he should have been much improved in my mind. In fact, he was just as bad on Christmas day as he was when I brought him in. It was Christmas day that I realized there was a strong possibility that I would lose him.

I took Harvey home on December 31, 2013 and watched him suffer, unable to walk without extreme pain, fearing that he would founder before A&M could do the arthrodesis surgery. He had the surgery but foundered afterward. He suffered every day, some days more than others. One day he was in so much pain I couldn't even brush him. I drove every day to see him. He just wanted to come home.

Watching Harvey suffer and die has been extremely traumatizing and life altering.

Harvey was euthanized on April 24, 2014.

Lucy Pustejovsky started her new job at Wharton Veterinary Clinic on June 2, 2014.

Stephanie Mosley started her new job at Hillside Veterinary Clinic on or around July, 2014.



December 11, 2013

Dr. Watts phoned Lucy Pustejovsky on December 11, 2013 to update her on Harvey's condition. According to Lucy Pustejovsky's notes, Harvey was "doing much better, lameness much improved." This was also completely false. I refer you to Page 2 of Dr. Watts Equine Orthopedic Survey Discharge Summary (Discharge Date December 31, 2013), wherein she states "Repeat radiographs on 12/16 and 12/24 revealed progression of the fetlock osteoarthritis and fetlock joint collapse." Harvey's lameness did not improve.
